DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS DR. RANDALL CAPPS '62 RECEIVES HIGH HONORS

The highest distinction the fraternity can offer, the Hall of Honor, recognizes members whose distinguished service to Sigma Nu has brought enduring strength and vitality to their fraternity. Likewise, the Hall of Fame is awarded to those alumni, living or dead, who have distinguished themselves in their respective fields, thus bringing credit to the fraternity.



Sigma Nu recognized as the Hall of Honor 74th Inductee **Dr. Randall Capps '62**. Randall began his service to Sigma Nu as Lt. commander, treasurer, marshal, and rush chairman during his undergraduate years. Following graduation, he served as advisor to his chapter from 1964 to 1972, and he was instrumental in founding the Eta Rho Chapter at Western Kentucky. He later served

as advisor to the chapter and was a member of its house corporation.

At the national level, Randall served the fraternity as division commander from 1971 through 1976. For two years, beginning in 1975, he was dean of the College of Chapters, and in 1976 he began his service as grand councilman. In 1978, he wrote the *Heritage History of Sigma Nu*, the first new history of the fraternity since the 1936 writing of *The Story of Sigma Nu* by John C. Scott and Charles E. Thomas. In 1980, Randall was elected the 47th regent of the fraternity.

Professionally, Randall is president and founder of Leadership Strategies International, a global business management consulting firm. He is also a visiting professor

of management in the Gordon Ford College of Business at Western Kentucky University. He has held several management and academic positions at Western Kentucky University, including chairman of the Department of Speech and Broadcasting and assistant to the president.

He has been recognized for his professional accomplishments, being selected as a recipient of the Outstanding MBA Teacher Award at the Gordon Ford College of Business and the Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce Global Business Advocate of the Year Award. Randall is an award-winning researcher and a renowned author of more than seven books.

He and his wife, Joan, reside in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

Andrew has many memories from his time in Eta Rho. "Winning most improved chapter and paying off nation-

als were both big accomplishments for the chapter; it was a good feeling to know I was a part of that. Also, winning Greek Man of the Year was a personal achievement that I am very proud of."

In addition to the memories, Andrew took away valuable relationships with alumni. He advises young alumni to get to know the alumni members. 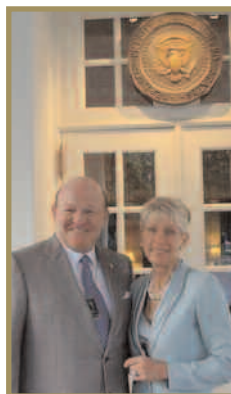
