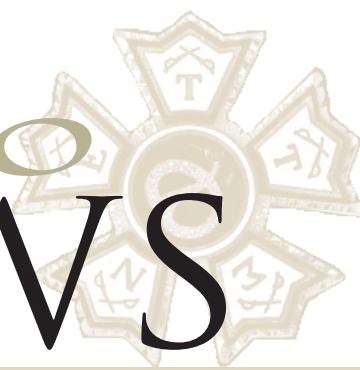

WKU FINALIZES PLANS FOR NEW GREEK VILLAGE Construction to Begin in Fall with Sigma Nu Likely Third in Line

Sigma Nu's housing future looks bright. I would like to share some exciting news. Despite the ever-changing plans over the last year and a half, we are happy to report that final designs for the new Greek Village have been approved by President Ransdell and WKU. The conceptual plan for the village can be found on our Web site at www.etarho.org.

According to Western Architecture Professor Neal Downing, "This is going to be the cornerstone for the northwest section of campus."

The new village will contain five Greek lots, located at 14th and Kentucky Streets on the northwest end of campus. The five fraternities committed to relocate are Phi Delta Theta, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Chi, Sigma Nu, and Sigma Phi Epsilon.

Eta Rho is planning to construct a 10,000 square-foot home with housing for 20. The design and layout of the house will depend on the lot we have and if we can have a basement.

The current streets must be extended and rerouted by Western before construction of homes can begin. This is expected to begin in mid-April and last through the summer. For the fraternities that have money in place, construction on their new houses can begin this fall.

"With your support, it is possible that within 18 months we can have a new house!"

Many of you, within the past year and a half, have been asked to pledge your financial support for a new fraternity house without a good understanding of where and what type of house is to be built. Those pledges, which total \$612,995, are a testament to the commitment of Eta Rho's alumni. However, we are still not where we need to be with total dollars pledged. We

anticipate needing approximately \$1 million to pay for the project.

At a recent meeting, the active chapter voiced their desire for a new house and pledged financial donations totaling \$14,000+. With our young membership, many of our current pledges and some of the active chapter will be the first to call the new house "home."

I don't think there is a single brother who doesn't have fond memories of the days at 1311 College Street. It is now time to help the next generation of Sigma Nus form memories in a new fraternity house that we can all be proud of.

The Home Association asks for the brothers who have pledged to please send in your current and any

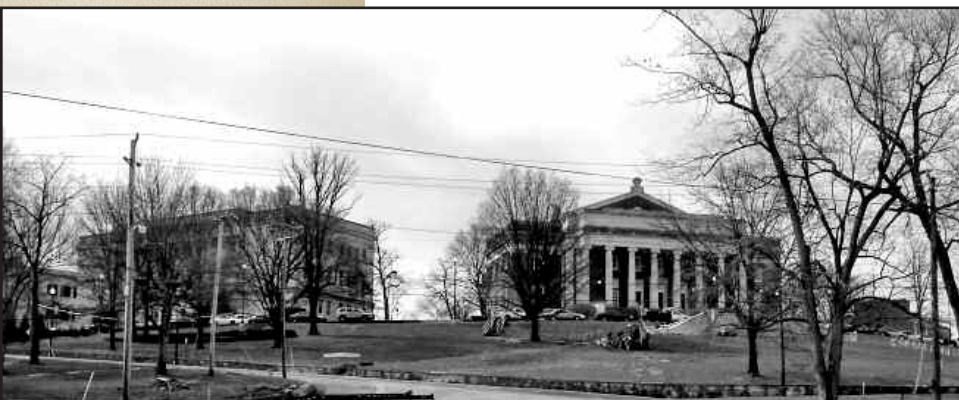

IMPROVED MEMBERSHIP AND ALUMNI INVOLVEMENT IMPACT ETA RHO'S ABILITY TO RISE QUICKLY AS A TOP-RANKED FRATERNITY AT WKU

I am proud to report that Eta Rho is finally out of debt! After several years of accumulation, the active chapter made it a priority to erase the debt. With the aid of our alumni, Eta Rho paid off a balance of more than \$15,000! Our chapter would like to thank the many alumni for aiding in this effort. What was once thought to be an insurmountable goal is now a reality and a great turning point in a growing chapter.

ETA RHO INVOLVED IN NUMEROUS WKU ORGANIZATIONS

Another high point for this year's chapter is the growing presence in clubs and organizations on campus. Not only does Eta Rho have presidents in organizations such as Government and Politics Society and Pi Sigma Alpha, but Eta Rho is the most represented chapter in IFC with two executive officers—something no other chapter at Western can claim.

Furthermore, we've had four people participate in Dynamic Leadership Institution, an organization in which members learn what

leadership skills they possess and skills they need to develop further, as well as learn applicable skills for the corporate world. Eta Rho's presence is spreading throughout campus and is evidence of the hard work exerted for the betterment of the chapter by its members.

ACADEMICS IMPROVING DUE TO TOP PRIORITY STATUS

Over the past few years, the chapter's academics have been a weak area needing some major work. Eta Rho has confronted this issue and made it a top priority. We aren't quite where we want to be, but we have made major progress already. I'm excited to report that our chapter's cumulative G.P.A. was three-tenths of a point higher than last semester's and that our candidate G.P.A. was in the top half of all IFC chapters. Furthermore, we had four times as many 3.0 averages than last semester. Clearly, great strides have been made to increase the quality of Eta Rho's academic standings.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

We have made the most progress over the course of this year in our community service involvement. Thus far, Eta Rho has totaled more than 800 hours of community service with an excess of \$1,000 donated to charities in the Bowling Green community. This was best highlighted by our chapter's annual Powderpuff Tournament. Nine fraternities and sororities competed, with all the funds raised benefitting the local Girls, Inc. Later in the spring, Eta Rho will team up with Sigma Kappa Sorority to host a Senior Prom for the elderly.

THANKYOU,ALUMNI

Nearly every aspect of Eta Rho has been much improved over the past year. By advancing membership and the quality of candidates, our chapter has made major strides in academics, campus leadership roles,

We don't believe that it would be feasible to begin a project of this size without a significant portion of the monies in hand. With your support, it is possible that within 18 months we can have a new house!

As it now stands, we are realistically third in line to begin construction, behind Sigma Alpha Epsilon and Sigma Chi, who have

considerably more money in place than we do. I ask of you: Do we want to be third string behind these two fraternities? Or do you want to step up, make your financial pledge, and get this new house up and going?

I hope you will join me in the latter.
